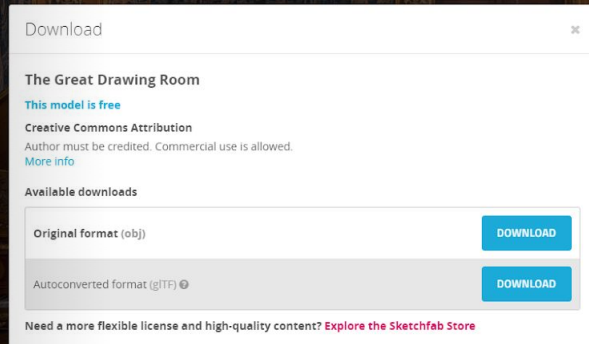
In February 2020, Sketchfab partnered with museums to create a body of public domain 3D models available under the CC0 dedication.

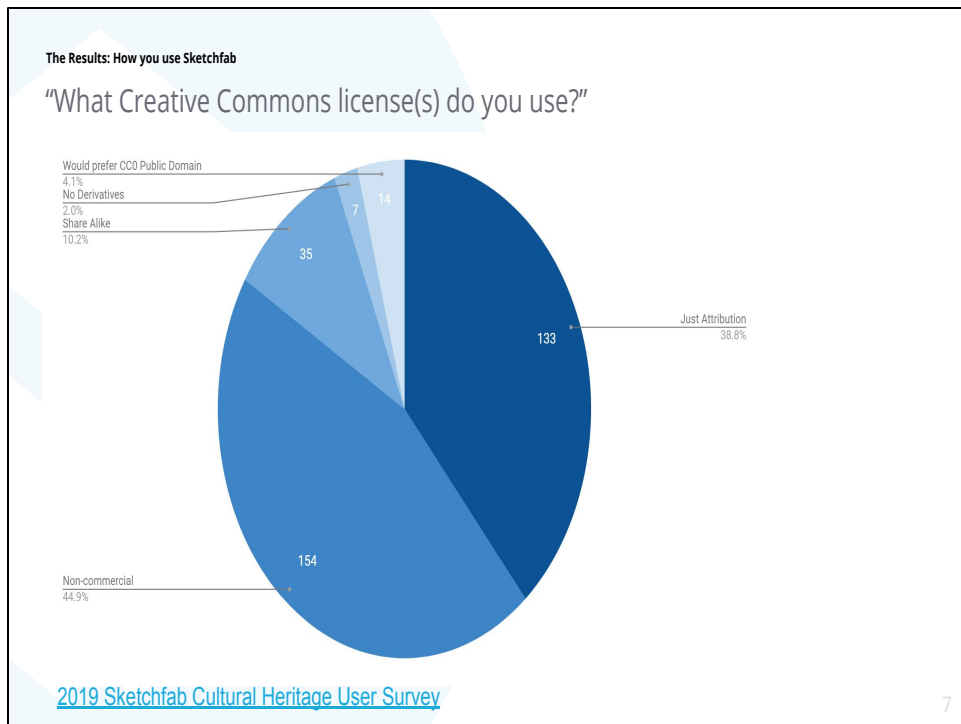

Existing Licenses

-  **CC BY - Attribution**
You must give you credit for the original work.
-  **CC BY-NC - Non Commercial**
You cannot use your model commercially
-  **CC BY-ND - No Derivatives**
You may use and share the model, but it cannot be altered.
-  **CC BY-SA - ShareAlike** Derivative work must be shared under the same license.
- All these licenses *assert a copyright over the 3D model.*



Sketchfab adopted Creative Commons Attribution licenses for downloadable 3D models in 2014 - users can choose to make their 3D data available under several flavours of the Attribution license.



Results from a 2019 survey of cultural heritage users on Sketchfab showed a range of licenses are in use, most significantly just attribution and non-commercial varieties. Some organisations said they would prefer a CC0 dedication.

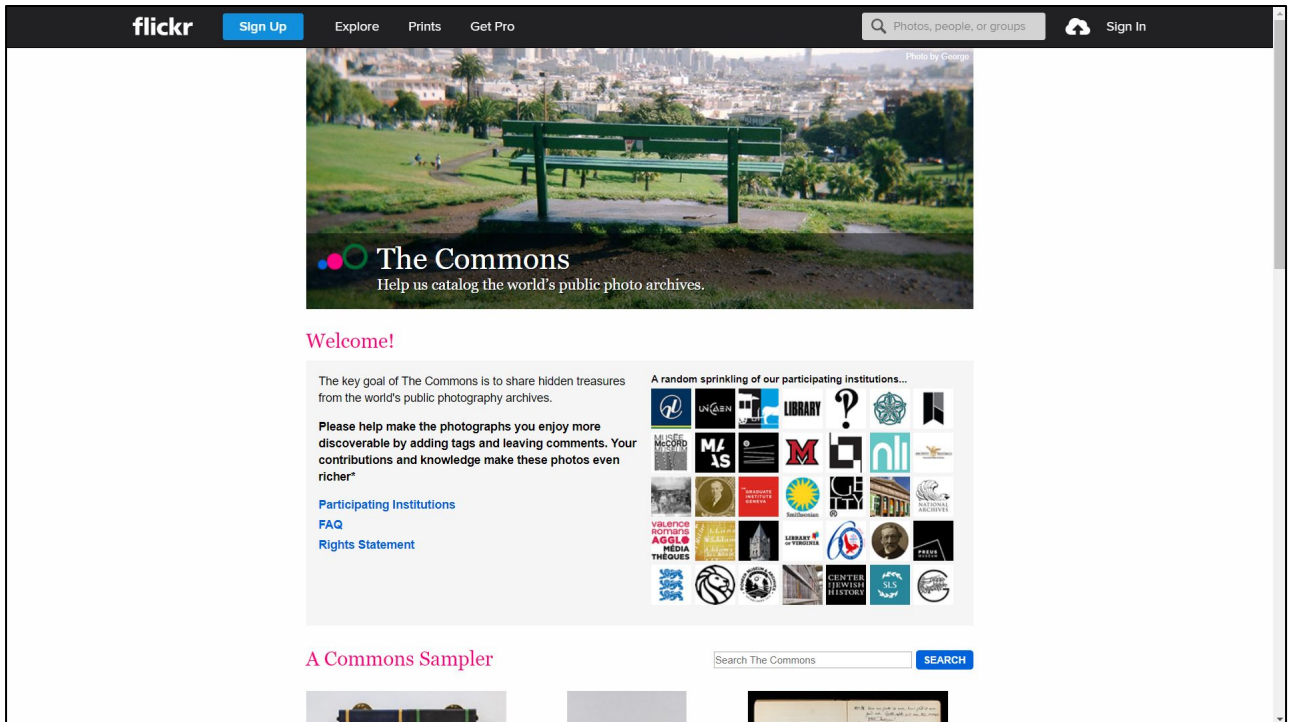

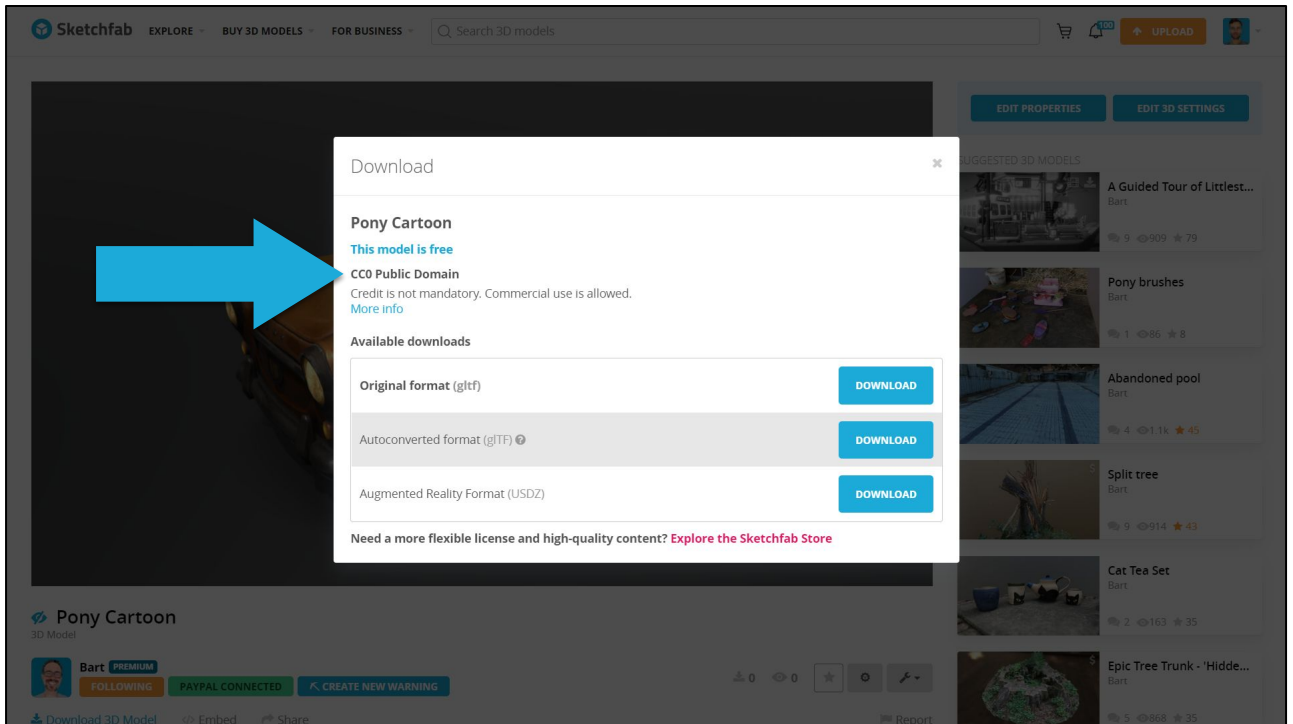


Other Information

Note: Creative Commons 0 is a *dedication* not a license. It indicates that the publishing author waives all rights under copyright law to the work the deed is associated with.



Sketchfab is not alone in creating a mechanism for its users to dedicate work to the public domain, The Flickr Commons launched in 2008 and is a well known and used resource.

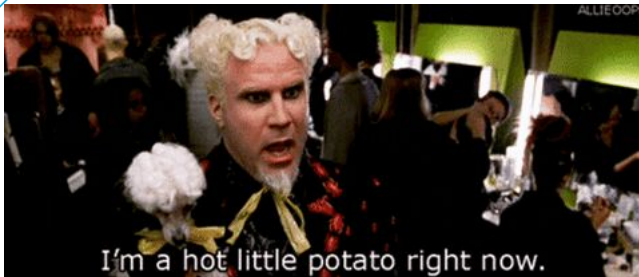


When a user downloads a model from Sketchfab, the license is indicated in the download pop-up.

CC0 & the Open Access trend

Open Access is a term born out of academia: the act of offering free and open access to **academic research** for others to build upon.

This philosophy has since extended to include **media** and **creative works**.



CC0 or the [Public Domain Mark](#) are being used by many cultural organisations as part of open access initiatives; it seems logical for Sketchfab (which [has long supported 3D publishing for cultural organisations](#)) to align with this trend.

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This page features items from the Library's digital collections that are free to use and reuse. 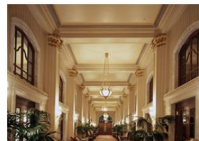

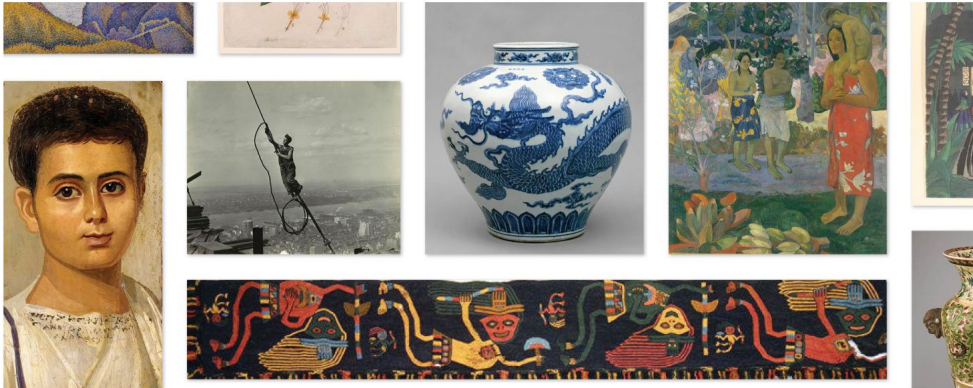
The Cleveland Museum of Art announced on January 23, 2019, that it is an Open Access institution, using the [Creative Commons Zero \(CC0\)](#) designation for high-resolution images and data as related to its collection. At the Cleveland Museum of Art, Open Access means the public now has the ability to share, collaborate, remix, and reuse images of many as 30,000 public-domain artworks from the CMA's world-


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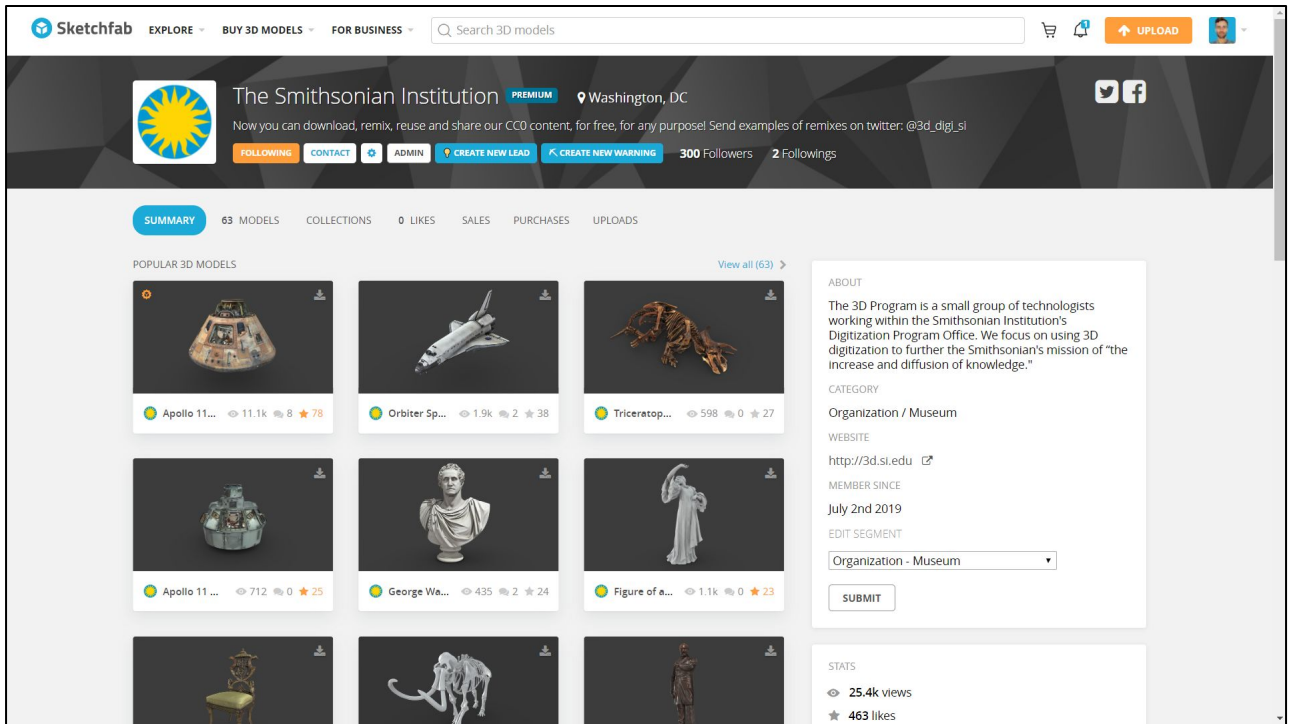


Open Access at The Met

On February 7, 2017, The Met made all images of public-domain works in its collection available under [Creative Commons Zero \(CC0\)](#).

And now the [Smithsonian Institution](#) too. Launching the CC0 dedication for 3D cultural heritage meant that Sketchfab could welcome SI to begin posting on an official Sketchfab profile. Sketchfab allows the Smithsonian to reach a massive, dedicated, and active 3D community with their 3D output.

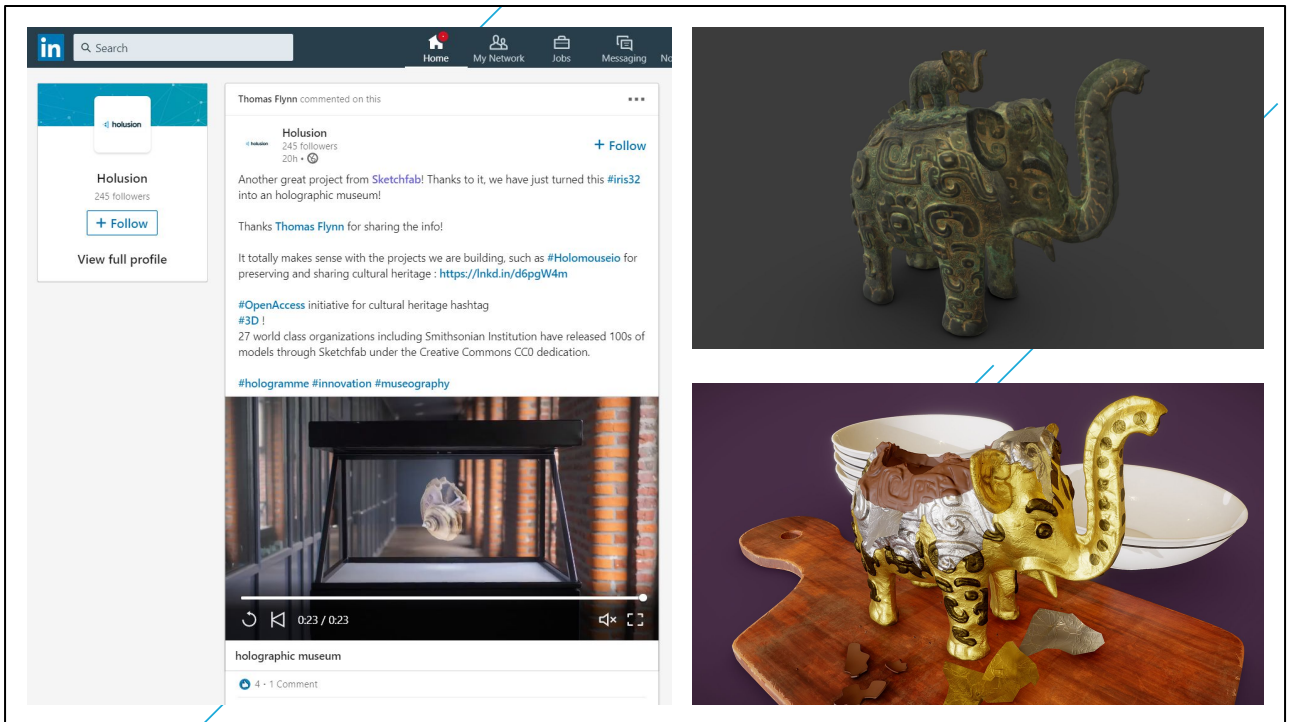

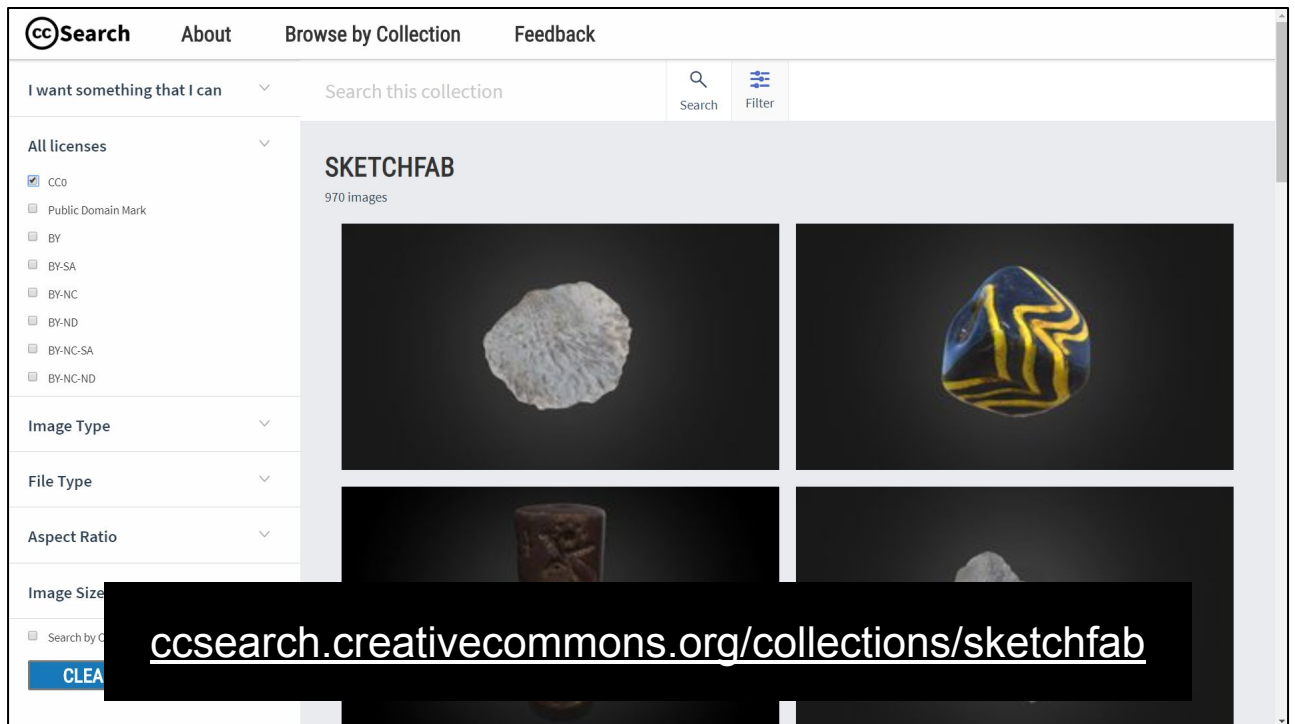

Institutional Barriers to Open Access

Some reasons given for not joining the [Sketchfab CC0 public domain dedication launch](#) in February 2020

Of 89 organisations who were contacted to join the initiative:

- 27 organisations joined the launch 🎉
- 49 were **unresponsive** after 3 email follow ups
- 14 declined the invitation

The responses from organisations that declined are provided on the next page.

Some themes that arise:

- OA is seen as in conflict with revenue generation
- The prospect of another party commercialising the 3D models is undesirable
- Existing agreements and policies (organisational & governmental) prohibit OA
- Discussions about OA are underway but progressing slowly
- Existing copyright in the digitisation subjects precludes OA distribution
- Maintaining the attribution link and institutional context (e.g. object information) is more of a priority than OA
- OA is sometimes seen as a radical action with unknown outcomes

Please note: this is not an attempt to 'name and shame' any particular organisation or member of staff but rather to illustrate the variety of institutional barriers to adopting open access (OA) policies.

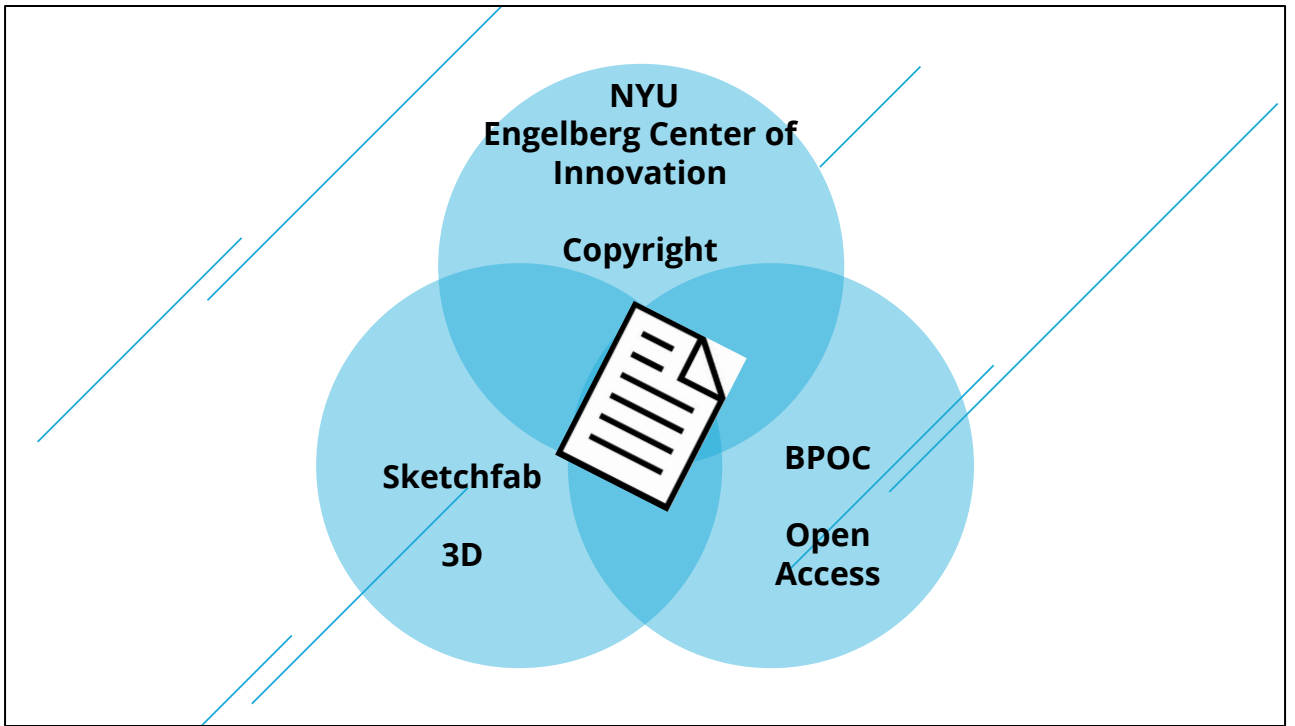
With only a couple of 3D models for digitisation, the response is great! Not electing to join doesn't mean that an organisation doesn't have an open access policy in some areas of its work.

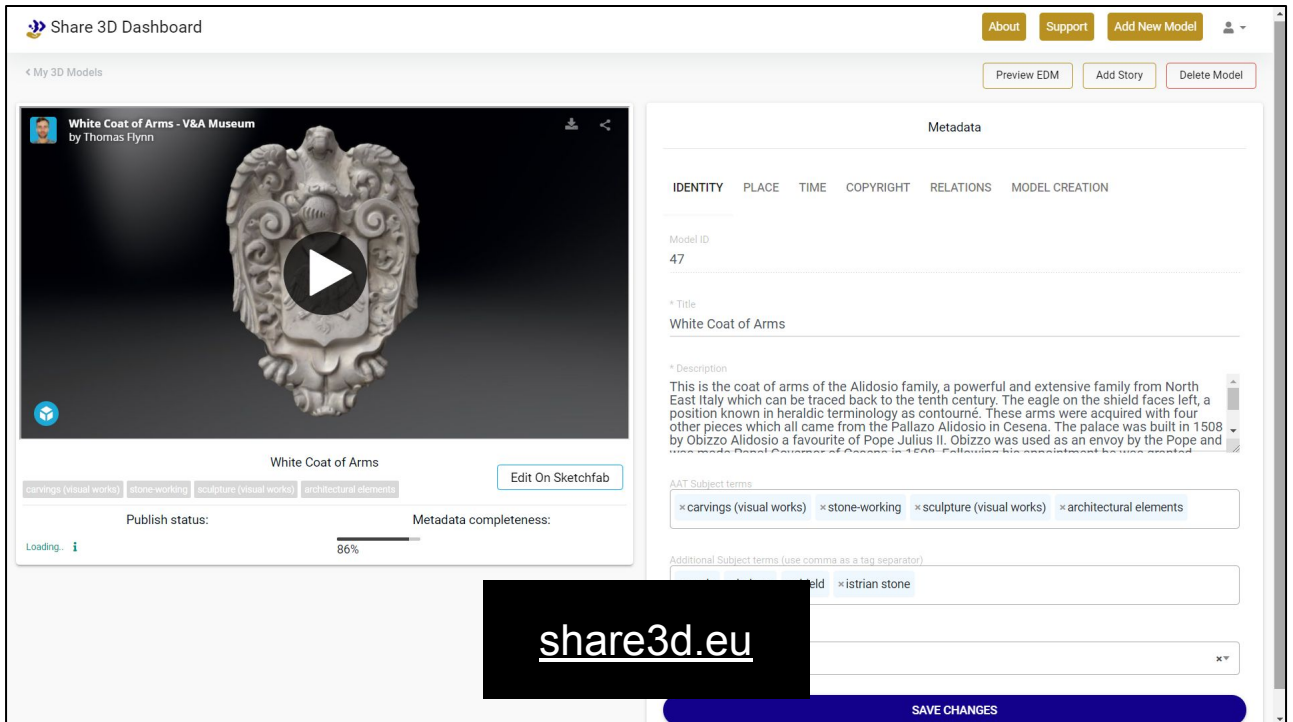

As a way of acknowledging how tricky it can be to make data open, we published some anonymised reasons that organisations did not join the CC0 launch.



3D, copyright and open access can be tricky subjects to navigate. Sketchfab is collaborating on a whitepaper with the [NYU Engelberg Center of Innovation](#) and [Balboa Park Online Collaborative](#) to provide wide ranging guidance.



Finally, on the theme of linking islands of data, Sketchfab is pleased to have partnered with several European organisations to build the share3d.eu platform which can be used to enrich 3D collections on [Europeana](https://europeana.eu), and soon complete the loop by encoding metadata back into 3D model entries on Sketchfab.
